With the aid of under floor heating beneath the paving, high level heating strips which frame the back wall, and inbuilt lighting, that can all be controlled remotely at the touch of a button; this room truly can be enjoyed all year round.

## Changing the mood at your fingertips

The design for this Notting Hill Town House includes lighting options that change the atmosphere at night, integrated speakers that connect via Bluetooth to the client's tablet or smart phone which means they can sit back and create a party mood.

And if the impending clouds threaten to spoil their evening at the click of a button, they can simply close the louvered blades weather tight, pull down integrated blinds or slide across invisible frame glass panels

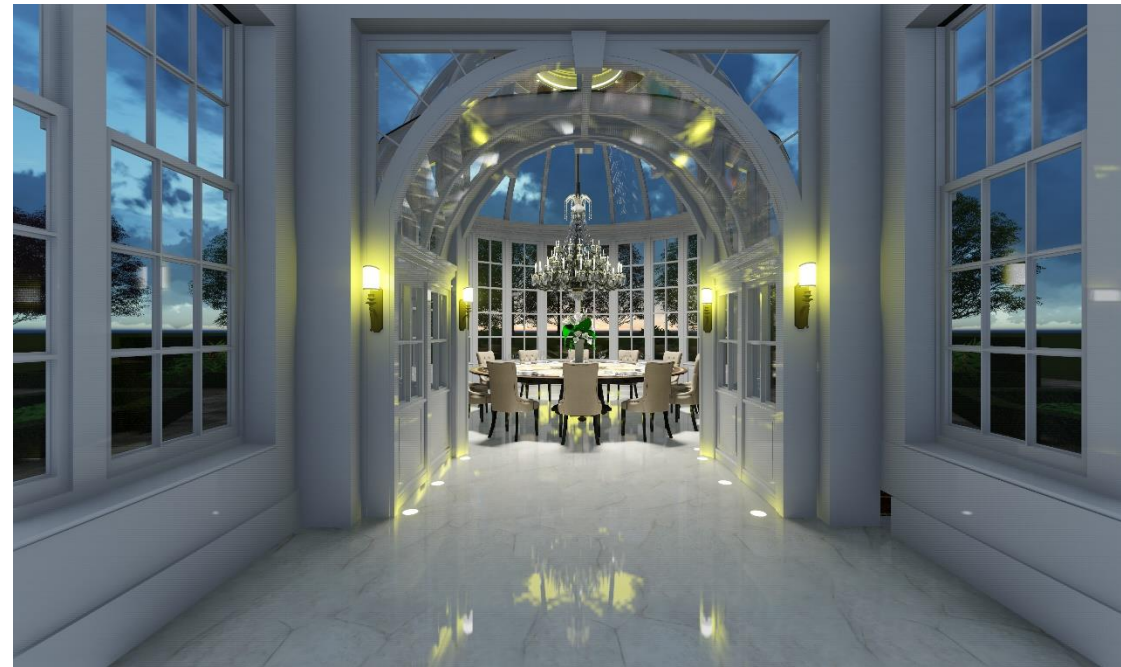

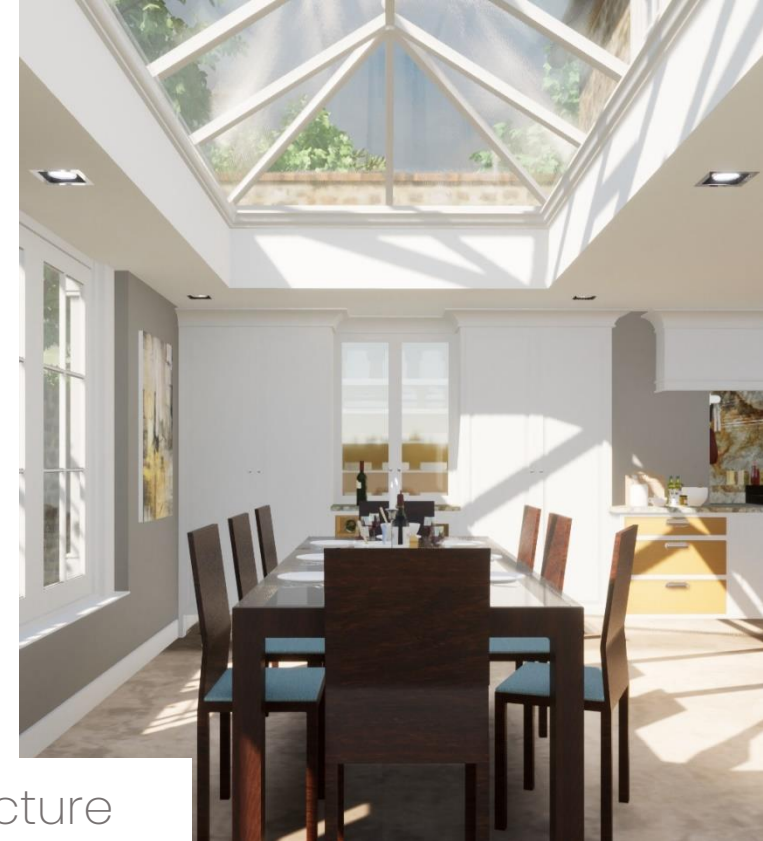


# Creating a perfect synergy between the outside world and your living area
